Is she **playing** now?



Present Simple

Do you **often talk** to your cat?



Present Simple

My cat **takes** a bath because she **likes** it.



Present Continuous

Yes, she is.
She's **playing** now.



Present Simple

Yes, I do. I **often talk** to my cat.



How to play grammar matching game

With a class

- Hand out one card to each student.
- Let them wander in the room and read their cards to their peers.
- **Student A** reads the card to **student B**. **Student B** reads the card to **student A**.
- They mustn't show their cards to each other.
- If the cards match (= the pictures match) they sit down.
- You may limit the time and make the game faster and more challenging.

The winners can be the first ones, or everybody.

How to play grammar matching game Memory / concentration game

The aim of the game is to collect as many pairs as possible.

- Shuffle the cards and lay them out on the table face down.
- The first player turns two cards over and reads them.
- If the two cards match (question and answer / same picture), the player takes the cards and put them aside.
- The player then has another turn for making a match and goes again.
- If the cards are not a match they are turned back over and it is now the next player's turn.
- You play until all the cards are taken.

The winner is the player with the most pairs.
